With shelter-in-place ending for most Georgians, officials urge Georgians to wear face coverings to fight COVID-19

On Thursday, April 30, Georgia Governor Brian Kemp announced the statewide Shelter in Place Order was expiring at 11:59 p.m. for most Georgians. Kemp said that moving forward, he urges Georgian's to stay home when possible. He thanked Georgian's for helping to flatten the curve and bolster healthcare infrastructure, but that the fight against COVID-19 is far from over. The governor said that businesses across the state must operate under strict social distancing and sanitation guidelines, through May 13, 2020.

Kemp said he was signing an order to protect the elderly and medically fragile by requiring those groups to continue to Shelter in Place until June 12, 2020. He is also ordering long term care facilities, including nursing homes and assisted living facilities to utilize enhanced infection control protocols, ensure safer living conditions and protect residents and staff from coronavirus exposure.

Kemp also announced that all bars, nightclubs, public swimming pools, live performance venues and operators of amusement park ride will remain closed through Wednesday, May 13, 2020.





husband Steve, Carmen Ramsey, and her husband Carol Poe Mark; three grandchildren, Justin, Corey, and Candi, along with other relatives.





Following the deadly storms and tornadoes in Northwest Georgia earlier this month, Rep. Tom Graves (R-GA-14) and Senators David Perdue (R-GA) and Kelly Loeffler (R-GA) sent a letter to President Donald Trump requesting a major disaster declaration for the State of Georgia. A major disaster declaration would make a range of additional federal resources and funds available. The Members of Congress requested that the declaration be made under the Stafford Act, which would allow the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to provide federal assistance to the state.

On April 12th and 13th severe storms and tornadoes touched down





We don't have an effective treatment, although there are some promising developments. Unless we get lucky, we're likely a year or two from having a vaccine - if we ever do. After many decades, we are still waiting for an HIV vaccine.

This virus caught the world off guard, and its trajectory is still highly unpredictable. We simply don't know what the future holds and what the end game for controlling the pandemic will be.

We need to understand we're only in the top of the 2nd inning of a nine-inning game, maybe just the bottom of the 1st. We need to realize we have a long road ahead of us.

As we reopen our Northwest Georgia communities, we expect to see an increase in virus transmission. We hope we'll also see, as we saw at the beginning of the pandemic, people changing their behavior to wisely continue

As of April 30, we've tested 2,123 people, a tiny sliver of our Northwest Georgia population. This voluntary, random-butscreened testing has produced less than 5% positives (compared to a statewide number of about

> It's hard to read anything into these results other than that they may indicate the small percentage of our population that's been exposed to and infected by the virus, another indication of just how far we have to go before the virus runs its course.

Eventually, we'll need to ramp up serologic testing (via a finger prick) to determine who has had the virus and may - or may not - be immune. We're not at that point yet, but we're beginning to see serology tests being offered by some private

FDA oversight of these tests and test results vary widely in reliability. So, we caution people about relying on them to determine if they might have had the virus and possibly be

capacity available in Northwest Georgia earlier in this crisis. We didn't. Failure of foresight, faulty strategy, technical flaws, and regulatory hurdles led to a national coronavirus testing shortfall we are trying to resolve.

We do wish we had more people contacting us right now to be screened for free Covid-19 testing. For the moment anyway, we've got reasonable testing capacity and have four test sites set up in Bartow, Floyd, Paulding, and Walker counties. We will be opening more of "pop-up" sites, and vou do not have to reside in the county where a test site is located to be tested.

Anyone with symptoms of Covid-19, such as fever, dry cough, shortness of breath, muscle aches, or lack of sense of smell or taste may receive free testing. We especially encourage anyone with symptoms and chronic medical conditions, such as diabetes, lung problems, heart problems, or obesity, to call for screening.

We're also free testing to people without workers, public safety workers, first responders, and other critical workers that may have been exposed to the virus while shelter-in-place lockdown.


